How we communicate

This year again we have taken the generic information out of this letter and the other termly letters and transferred the information into a booklet which you can keep for the year. We hope that this will be an easy reference guide for you and that you will find it useful. The termly letters from now on will only refer to subjects relevant to that term. The major change to all of this will of course be the references to Covid-19.

Staffing

After 30 years at Wallace Hall Academy, Mr Nick Riley retired at the end of last term and Miss Louise Girvan has joined us as our new Music teacher. Mr Adam Torbett has left and Mr Lewis Gray was appointed to teach History/Modern Studies in our Social Subjects faculty. Mr Robert Watt has replaced Miss Poying Ho in our Maths department and Mr Alex Evans has joined our Physics Team following Mr Sean Dawson's departure. Mrs Emma Clarke will be teaching Drama at Wallace Hall Academy 1-day per week, Miss Kayleigh Simmers joins our PE Department for 3-days each week and Mrs Lauren Currie will be teaching 2-days a week in our Modern Languages department starting after the October holidays. Mr Euan Laverty is currently our Acting PT Additional Support for Learning following Mrs Aileen Marchant's appointment to our Restart and Recovery post, Mrs Melissa McGhie joins us as our new SDS Careers Adviser and Mrs Alice Bainbridge, our Office Manager, is taking up a new post as a Project Co-ordinator at The Bridge.

I would like to take this chance to thank all of our staff who have moved on and wish them well for the future as well extending a warm welcome to our new members of staff.







SQA Results

For the second year running, as a result of Covid-19, pupils were not given the opportunity to sit their examinations in the normal way. Teachers were asked to provide Estimate Grades based on pupil performance in assessments. As Head Teacher of Wallace Hall Academy, I was incredibly proud of the way pupils worked so hard to do their best in the assessments and of the hard work and professionalism shown by both teaching staff and support staff from within the school in supporting pupils through the process. I am also thankful to you, the parents and carers, who supported both the individual pupils and the school through the process and I am delighted with our pupils' SQA results. I have detailed these in the tables below for your information.

We are very pleased with the overall results and, as instructed by the Scottish Government and the SQA, are planning for a more traditional exam diet this session which will run from the end of April to early June 2022. However, to take account of the fact that things are still returning to normal the SQA have made a number of changes to individual courses for session 2021-22 and teachers are currently using this information to plan effective learning and teaching programs for all Senior Phase pupils.

Parent Council

Two Parent Council meetings are usually held each term and our first one of this academic session is being held on Monday 6th September with the AGM scheduled for Monday 4th October. Due to Covid-19 restrictions, meetings will continue to take place remotely until further notice. S4-S6 Options

All pupil course options are now finalised. It is <u>essential</u> that every pupil attends all their classes and catches up on any work they may have missed due to course changes. To help in this process, staff will be doing a final check to ensure pupils are entered at the appropriate level following their examination results. It is now expected that all pupils will complete any course they have started and that they will not be requesting changes.

Annual Data Checks

The annual data check forms have been issued to pupils during their Health and Wellbeing classes. Please can you complete and return this form as soon as possible to the school office to allow any changes to be made to our database. It is important that details such as parental contact information and medical conditions are kept up to date. Also in the envelope is a local trip/sporting fixture permission form and for some a request for photo permissions and parental email if we do not already have these details.

University Open Days

Over the coming months some of our senior students will be applying to study courses at university. With many higher education establishments to choose from, we encourage our young people to explore their options by attending university open days. Many of these days will be organised on a virtual basis and pupils should join in with the institutions that they are interested in. School Photographer

The school photographer will be in Wallace Hall Primary on Wednesday 27th October and in Wallace Hall Academy on Thursday 28th October. Primary pupils will get the opportunity for individual and family photographs on the Wednesday. Secondary students will get the opportunity for individual and family photographs on the Thursday. However, pupils in the secondary who have younger siblings in the primary will have the chance to get a family photograph taken in the primary on Wednesday 27th October. If required, a catch-up session will be arranged for later in the term.

School Clubs and Extra Curricular Activities

School clubs and extra-curricular activities play a very important part in providing opportunities for achievement for our youngsters and we encourage pupils to take part in these. However, due to Covid-19 restrictions, the offer of clubs may be more limited than usual and we are awaiting further guidance from Education Scotland on what activities we are able to offer. Once we have these, we will inform our parents of all school clubs and extra-curricular activities taking place this academic session.

Wallace Hall Electives Programme

Every week S3 pupils take part in an Elective period with S5 and S6 pupils taking part in an Elective period every two weeks. This programme is designed to give our pupils some wider experiences outside their usual timetabled classes. Pupils find our Electives really rewarding and they develop a number of new transferrable skills that will benefit them in the future. This year our S3 Electives are: Activity Tourism, Duke of Edinburgh, Eco-Committee and Fitness, Performance and Development; our S5 Electives are: Food for the Future, LGBTQ+ Charter, Car/Bike Maintenance, Pupil Support, Barista and Eco-Committee; our S6 Electives are Charities Committee, Eco-Committee, Library Committee, Pupil Support, Social Committee, Yearbook Committee and Young Enterprise.

Health and Wellbeing Update August

All S1-6 pupils participate in Health and Wellbeing lessons on a weekly basis. These lessons are delivered by tutors or outside organisations and aim to support our young people in improving their overall health and wellbeing. Duke of Edinburgh Awards Scheme

Our Duke of Edinburgh Awards Scheme is being offered as part of our Electives programme this year and we have had a very healthy uptake from our S3 pupils.

Due to Covid restrictions, pupils were unable to complete the expedition section of the award last year. However, we will organise for these pupils to undertake this requirement as soon as it is safe to do so.

If you are interested in helping with the DofE Award Scheme, please contact Mr McKenna at the school. Any help or assistance would be appreciated and we are especially keen to find individuals who are willing to support our expeditions. We will provide all the training required.

The School Calendar

Due to the constraints of Covid-19, we are unable to populate our school calendar (Appendix B) until further guidance is received from Scottish Government and Education Scotland. However, we will communicate dates for organised events/activities with you as soon as we are able to. School Trips

All school trips will adhere to government guidance with the level of risk monitored on an individual basis before the trip goes ahead. Information will be communicated to relevant parents/carers prior to any trip taking place. At present, we are advised that international trips should not take place until further guidance is received from the government.

Instrumental Music Instruction 2021-2022

Dumfries and Galloway Instrumental Service offer pupils from primary 5 onwards the opportunity to learn to play a musical instrument. Tuition is delivered by music instructors in the following disciplines: strings, brass, woodwind, guitar and percussion. All lessons are delivered on a group basis online through Microsoft Teams or in person, dependant on timetabling. Secondary pupils have their lessons delivered on a rota basis during the school day to ensure they don't regularly miss any one subject. Lessons follow a structured course of study which is suited to the pupil's abilities as well as SQA, local authority and school requirements.

Lessons for the 21/22 academic year are funded by the Scottish Government. The IMS is able to loan orchestral instruments to pupils free of charge. Guitars and percussion instruments are not available for loan. However, they are normally available to use in school.


