School Clubs and Extra Curricular Activities

School clubs and extra-curricular activities play a very important part in providing opportunities for achievement for our youngsters and we encourage pupils to take part in these. This session we are aiming to offer as many activities as possible and an updated programme will be available to all our young people and families in September. Our extra-curricular programme provides excellent opportunities for our learners, improving both their mental and physical health.

Wallace Hall Electives Programme

Every week S3 pupils and every two weeks S5 and S6 pupils take part in an Elective period. Elective periods are designed to give our pupils some wider experiences outside their usual timetabled classes. Pupils find our Electives really rewarding and they develop a number of new transferrable skills that will benefit them in the future. This year our Electives are as follows:

S3 Electives are: Cake Craft, Duke of Edinburgh, Fitness & Performance Development and PC Passport;

S5 Electives are: Rights Respecting Schools, Equalities, Eco-Committee, School Show Production and Web Design;

S6 Electives are Charities Committee, Eco-Committee, Library Committee, Pupil Support, Social Committee, Yearbook Committee and Web Design.

HPV and other Vaccines

We are still receiving guidance on this year's vaccination programme which will include S3 teenage boosters, seasonal flu, S6 catch-ups and S1-S6 MMR. We will send information home when this programme has been finalised.

Health and Wellbeing Update August

We have made some exciting changes to the way in which HWB is delivered this year. Each term, pupils will cover four HWB topics, spending two lessons on each topic. Teachers have been assigned to a topic per term and will deliver the two lessons to every class within the year group. This will mean that, once a topic has been covered, pupils will move onto a new topic, and a different teacher will attend the class to deliver this. We are piloting this model as we believe that it will have a positive impact on learning and teaching.

Duke of Edinburgh Awards Scheme

Our Duke of Edinburgh Awards Scheme is being offered as part of our Electives programme this year and we have had a very healthy uptake from our S3 pupils.

Last year's cohort have been prepared for expeditions and have been issued with their logins to complete their online tracking of their Volunteering, Skill and Physical sections before undertaking their expeditions. We would appreciate if they have completed at least 2 of their online sections before this. A drop-in session will run with Mr McKenna by appointment at lunchtimes to assist S3 – S4 candidates with completion of this.

School Trips

All school trips will adhere to government guidance with the level of risk monitored on an individual basis before the trip goes ahead. Information will be communicated to relevant parents/carers prior to any trip taking place.

Parking outside the School

Can I remind you that vehicles should <u>not</u> be parked in the disabled spaces or in the drop-off/pick-up area outside the primary school? We would appreciate your co-operation in using the main school car park unless you or your child is disabled and has an official disability badge displayed inside the front windscreen of the vehicle.

Parents who are making use of this area should ensure that it is used just to drop off students during the school day. If you are collecting a young person or need to wait at the school for any reason please use the main car park only.

The drop-off area should not be used at all between 8.30am and 9.15am and 3pm and 4pm, as per the signage in the bay, this area is for buses and disabled badge holders only at these times.

Instrumental Music Instruction 2024-2025

Dumfries and Galloway Instrumental Service offer pupils from primary 5 onwards the opportunity to learn to play a musical instrument. Tuition is delivered by music instructors in the following disciplines: strings, brass, woodwind, guitar and percussion. All lessons are delivered on a group basis online through Microsoft Teams or in person, dependant on timetabling. Secondary pupils have their lessons delivered on a rota basis during the

school day to ensure they don't regularly miss any one subject. Lessons follow a structured course of study which is suited to the pupil's abilities as well as SQA, local authority and school requirements.

Lessons for the 23/24 academic year are funded by the Scottish Government. The IMS is able to loan orchestral instruments to pupils free of charge. Guitars and percussion instruments are not available for loan. However, they are normally available to use in school.


